## Overview

This feature allows you to restore a configuration file for Apache, Pure-FTP or ProFTP, and the nameserver (`named` or `nsd`) daemons. This is useful when the current configuration for any of these daemons does not work.

## Configuration files

The following table lists the configuration files that you can roll back:

| File location                                  | Description | Type of server daemon |
|--|-------------|-----------------------|
| <code>/usr/local/apache/conf/httpd.conf</code> | Apache      | web server            |
| <code>/etc/named.conf</code>                   | named       | DNS server            |
| <code>/etc/nsd.conf</code>                     | NSD         | DNS server            |
| <code>/etc/pure-ftp.conf</code>                | Pure-FTP    | FTP server            |
| <code>/etc/proftp.conf</code>                  | ProFTP      | FTP server            |

**Note:**

The interface only displays buttons for the configuration files of your server's installed daemons.

## Restore configuration files

To restore the configuration files, perform the following steps:

1. Click the button that corresponds to the configuration file that you wish to restore. The interface will display the desired server daemon's configuration file.

**Note:**

You **cannot** edit the file from the interface.

2. Use the < and > buttons to select the desired backup file.
  - The interface displays the file's version number, date, and time between the navigation buttons.
3. Click *Restore*.
